Yugoslavia took over the organization of this tournament at the last minute (it was supposed to be held in the Soviet Union, but was cancelled). Thirty juniors competed in the five preliminary groups (2 out of each group qualified for the finals).

As compared to the ruling at the Second Championship, now the regulations provided for a supplementary match of four games between Gheorghiu and Janata. The match was held in Vrnjačka Banja and ended 2-2, four draws. Gheorghiu became the world champion because in the tournament he fared better according to the Sonneborn-Berger system.
